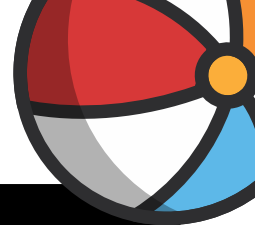

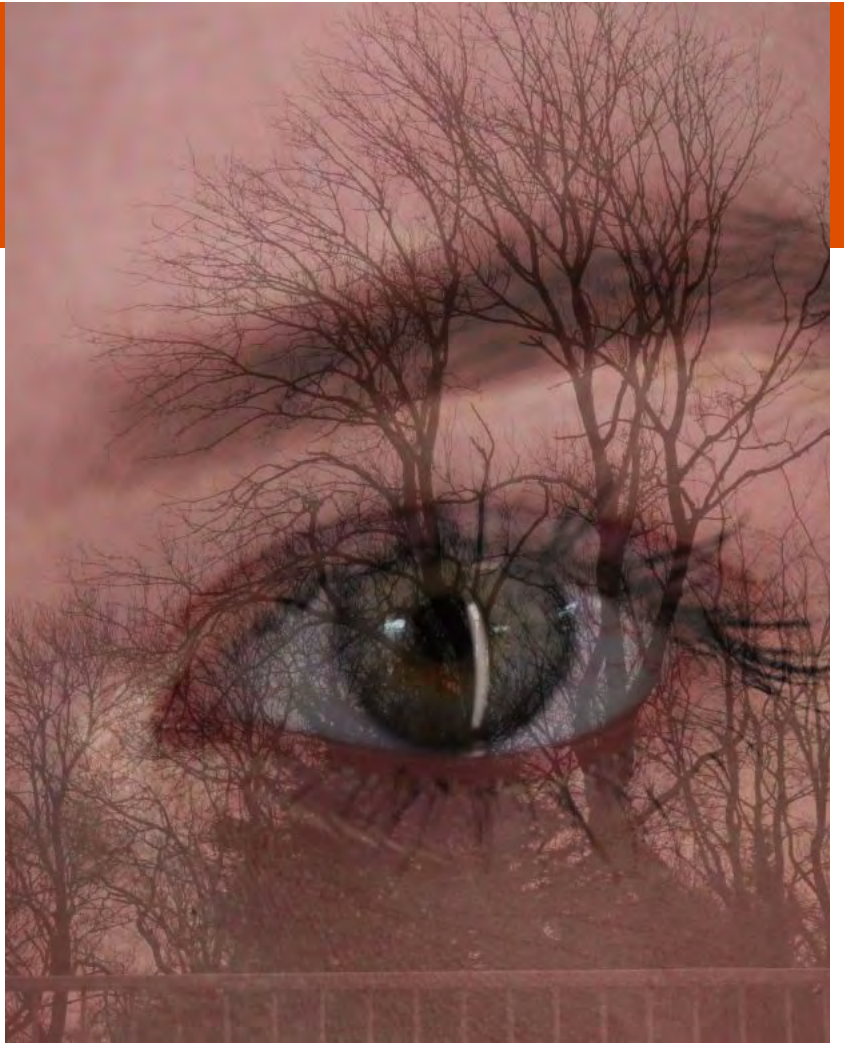

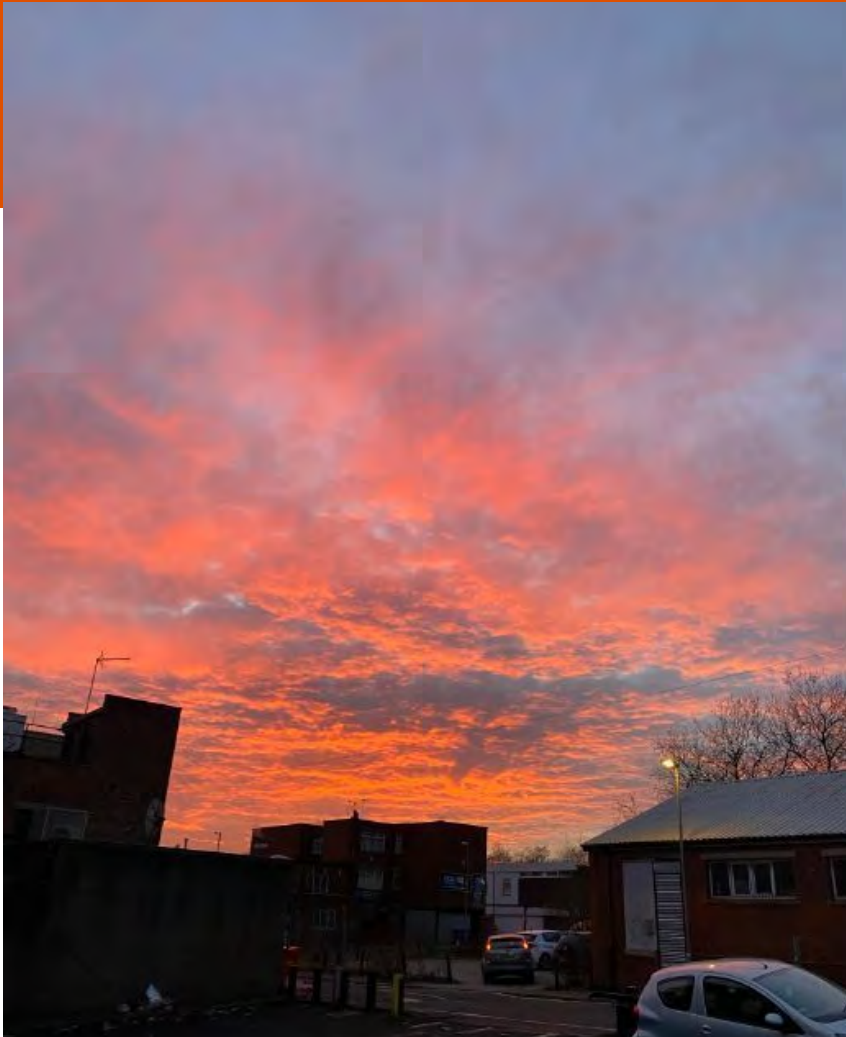

The Year 10 Geography students have been hard at work completing their fieldwork needed for their GCSE paper 3. At the end of March, they went to visit Salford Quays as they have been looking at the Urban Issues of Manchester and the solutions that have been put in place to help regenerate the area. Mollie-Mae said “It was interesting to see how a brownfield site has been regenerated with the Lowry Theatre and shopping centre”. Salford Quays is also home to Media City UK which has brought highly-skilled workers to the area. The students were looking at the hypothesis of “has the regeneration of Salford Quays had a positive effect on the local area?” Students investigated this by completing Environmental Quality surveys, questionnaires and pedestrian/traffic counts. Mollie-Mae said that “Counting the pedestrians and vehicles in the area shows how the area is being used by people travelling for work and leisure, linking to the regeneration happening at Salford Quays”.

Later on in the day, we travelled to the red side of Manchester and visited Old Trafford, learning what the club and the stadium have done to help the local area. Students were then treated to the Museum and a Stadium Tour. Alfie W in Year 10 said “I enjoyed seeing the history of the club and how it grew by people supporting the team and how this has helped grow the community”. He was one of many students who enjoyed the visit. Even the Man City supporters had a great time.



The Year 10's will be heading to the Castleshaw centre in Oldham to complete their Physical Geography fieldwork, where they will look at the change in the river channel of the River Tame as it moves downstream. They will conduct field sketches, measure the depth and speed of the river as well as measuring different pebbles to find their hypothesis. We want to send a big thank you to Trammell Crow who has funded all of our Year 10 field trips this year meaning students did not have to pay anything towards it, without them we wouldn't be able to do this essential part of their GCSE. 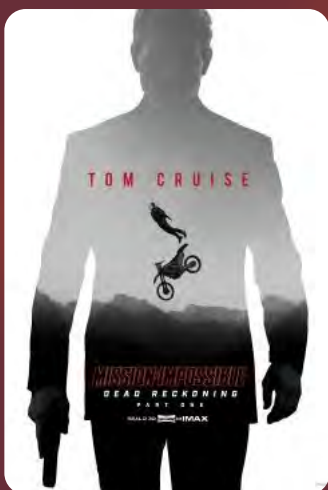
